Mack begins his 2nd year as Head Coach in 2009. A Titan himself, Mack earned honors as 1995 and 1996 1st Team All Rio Hondo League, 1st Team All San Gabriel Valley, All CIF, and in 1995, All State. Mack was a part of the 1995 CIF Championship team.

After his successful high school career, Mack went on to play 4 years of college baseball, earning honors as All Big 12 shortstop at Iowa State University. In 1998, Mack was drafted by the Detroit Tigers.

After leaving professional baseball, Mack continued his passion for baseball by developing young players, as Assistant Baseball Coach for Cal Poly Pomona, Baseball Program Director for the California Baseball Academy, Instructor and Coach for Baseball Factory (college recruiting service,) and as a Coach for the Danville Dans (prestigious summer wood bat league for collegiate level players.)

In addition to his current role with SMHS, Mack continues to develop community youth baseball through private and group instruction.

■ John Gulick


John Gulick brings a high level of experience to the team, particularly in the mental aspects of the hitting. John is the Varsity 1st base coach on game day. A native of Stockton, CA, John earned high honors on each of his baseball teams in high school and college. His high school team NEVER lost a regular season game. John Attended San Joaquin Delta City College and Wichita State University. While at SJDCC, he earned Golden Gate Conference 1st Team Honors and 2nd Team Junior College All American Honors. At WSU, he earned Missouri Valley All Conference Honors as a 1st baseman. WSU earned several #1 rankings and set a school record for most wins in a season in 1994. They also made two appearances in the College World Series.

Player Commitment to Titan Baseball

- Titan Baseball supports players who wish to participate in multiple sports in high school.
- Titan Baseball does require; however, a strong commitment to baseball during the spring sports season.
- Excellence in baseball does require a year-round commitment to the sport.
 - If you are playing another sport, we ask that you spend time each week working on your baseball skills.
 - If you are not participating in another sport, you should be participating in Summer, Fall or Winter baseball development programs.

Preparation

- All positions will be earned.
 - If you aren't working hard, realize that others are.

Building the Team

- Fundamental vs. Athletic
 - We will play fundamental baseball, and the most fundamentally sound players will play.
- Smart Baseball
 - With sound players, over-coaching is unnecessary.
- Role Players
 - Each player adds value to the team, as long as each player knows his role.

Baseball, the Great Equalizer

- Physical--Stay strong 7+ innings, 20+ games
- Mental—Always alert, see in advance, visualization
- Emotional—Handle highs and lows, success and failure

Fall/Winter Baseball

- Unless competing in CIF for another sport you are strongly encouraged to participate in the baseball development plan.
- ~20 players will be playing on the fall and winter baseball teams. These players will include returning varsity and others as space allows and need arises.

- Practice Monday-Friday
- Frosh practices at Del Mar in season and on McNamee Field pre-season
- Players should arrive at Del Mar, dressed for practice by 2:30.
- JV and Varsity at McNamee Field; dressed and on field by 2:15
- The official CIF start for spring athletics is February 16, 2009
